Two teams top their divisions; one more is second

TOP OF THE CLASS

Two of Cippenham's teams sit proudly at the top of their respective divisions after the first weekend of matches in the Junior British League. A magnificent performance by 12-years old Joanna Parker, playing at number three for the girls "A" team has put her team at the top of the Girls' Premier Division with a great chance of becoming national champions when the second half takes place in February. The England U12 champion won nine of her ten matches to top the division's averages where she is in competition with girls nearly five years her senior.

Gemma Chapman also had a good weekend, winning seven matches as did Emily Dearing, a Yorkshire player assisting the Cippenham team this season. The Cippenham side won four of its five matches, drawing once with Glamorgan Girls who share the top position on nine points. The weekend got off to a good start with a 6-0 thrashing of Darlington and then Irish Girls were dispatched 5-1, a match which registered Joanna's only defeat, to Louise Long when Cippenham were already 5-0 ahead. Saturday finished with a 3-3 draw with Glamorgan. In this match Cippenham were 2-0 down before Jo defeated Charlotte Avery for the first of her brace that put Cippenham 3-2 up. Gemma, however, failed to emulate Jo's win when given the opportunity to wrap up both points. Sunday produced a 5-1 win over Grove and then 4-2 against the Scottish team Blairgowrie.

The boys' second team also heads its division. A very young team of Thomas Mitchell (aged 13), Bradley Evans (10) and David Hayes (11) performed superbly throughout to gain seven points and head a very close Division 3A by one point from Mid Cheshire. Bradley, the England under-10 champion, playing against boys as old as 17, emphasised his huge potential by

finishing second in the division's averages with seven wins from ten. Tom won six and David five as Cippenham won three and drew one of the five matches.

Saturday produced a 100% record for Cippenham "B" with a 4-2 win over Byng Hall being followed by successes over Mid Cheshire by 5-1 and Team Peniel "B" 4-2. David had a great day winning five of his six matches including a brace in both of the tight 4-2 results. Sunday was different, however, as he failed to score in the 2-4 defeat to Dunstable Pioneers and a 3-3 draw with Edmonton "B", a match in which Tom won two for Cippenham.

The boys' first team were nearly as successful, also gaining seven points, and lie in second place in Division 1 behind Scotland "A". Warren Brooks won nine of his ten sets for Cippenham and is placed second in the division's averages. John Camilleri, from Banbury, who travels to Cippenham every week for coaching, won five but Robert Hansell had the more difficult matches, play-

ing in the number one position, and could only manage three wins. This team was more successful on the second day as only three points were gained on Saturday after an opening 4-2 win over Streetly, a 3-3 draw with Scotland and a 2-4 defeat to London club York Gardens Progress. Sunday produced better form with 4-2 victories over Ormesby (Middlesborough) and Glamorgan.

The only team that endured lesser results was the girls' second team which was making its debut in Division 2. One win, by 5-1 in the final match against Essex Girls, and a draw with East Lancashire resulted in the team finishing in fifth place. However, 12 years old Hannah Stone won five of her eight matches and Emma Human half of her ten, whereas Helen Smith and Francesca Parnell were less successful with only two each out of six.

A great team spirit existed throughout the weekend, due partially to all the players travelling together in the Westgate School's new minibus.

TITLES FOR JAMES AND JO AS CIPPENHAM STAGES ANOTHER GREAT EVENT

U9/10/11 Open

Cippenham's James Milton won the Under-11 Boys' Singles, the blue ribband event at the Cippenham Under-9/10/11 1 Star Open Championships on 24th October. The home player was never troubled during the day in a repeat of his victory in the same event at the Young Players' Summer Festival in June. James, however, was only one of several successful players from the Club which again demonstrated its prowess in the younger age groups.

James' opponent in the final of the U11 event was Kent's Nick Chatfield, the only visiting player to make the semi-final stage at which point James beat Joe Misseldine while Chatfield defeated Gavin Evans. The presence of Myles Evans and Nicholas Mellish in the quarter-finals meant that Cippenham provided five of the last eight players.

These same players dominated also the younger events with Chatfield taking away the U10 Boys' Singles after defeating Gavin Evans in the final while Joe Misseldine beat Myles Evans in the U9 final. Once again Chatfield was the only visitor to reach the semis of the U10 where Myles and Joe were the beaten players and George Bone and Edward Flower completed a Cippenham quintet in the quarter-finals.

The U9 Boys' Singles also had three Cippenham players in the semi-finals but in this event it was Myles Evans, who beat his younger brother Gavin, and Jo Misseldine who progressed before the latter won the final in fine style.

Kent was the most successful county in the girls' events with Anusha Severeratne saving five match points in the second game of the U11 final to defeat her county colleague Gemma Yarnley while the latter's sister Laura won the U9 round robin. In the U10 Girls' Singles, Cippenham's Rebecca Tweedy reached the final before losing out to Sarra Wong.

The consolation events also provided some success for the Cippenham contingent with Caroline Linz and Matthew Tucker winning the U11 Girls' and U10 Boys' respectively.

The most outstanding display of young talent was demonstrated by Gavin Evans. Incredibly, Gavin reached the semi-finals of all three events, progressing to the final of the U10 - and all that at just six years of age! He will surely follow in his brother Bradley's footsteps and become an England champion in due course and with brother Myles also being one of the very best players in the country for his age it all looks very promising for the Evans dynasty.
