

Clean Sweep at Bucks Junior Closed

Even though the star players were away at other tournaments, Cippenham members kept up their incredible winning ways at the Bucks Junior Closed Championships on 29 November. Two titles for Ashley Shaw, another for his brother Oliver, and others also for Matthew Tucker and Chris Witchell maintained Cippenham's record of having only ever lost one title in the last eight years.

The entry was lacking in both quantity and quality and the girls' events were cancelled altogether. However, the Shaw brothers showed what tremendous progress they have made in the past two years training at Cippenham as they led the host club's domination.

The main event, the Junior Singles produced a final between the Shaw brothers with 14-years old Ashley beating 16-years old Oliver in four games. They also combined to take the Junior Doubles event by beating another Cippenham pairing of Michael Steadman and Alex Polding three-straight in the final.

The Cadet Singles event produced the only defeat of the day for Ashley Shaw when beaten by Matthew Tucker 12-10 in the fourth game of the final. Completing a quartet of Cippenham members in the semi-finals were Ben Wiseman and Chris Witchell. Chris was the only player to successfully defend a title from last year when he beat Alex Polding 11-9 in the fifth game of an exciting final in the Under-13 Singles.

Robert Hansell, a player who has progressed through the coaching structure at Cippenham retained his Men's Singles title at the Club's annual championships on 9 November. The 19-years old Oxford University student justified his top seeding by winning the final in three straight games against the younger James Milton. Robert, the current Buckinghamshire champion, came through his group in top place and then beat his father Nick in the quarter-finals. Semi-final victim was Slough Closed champion David Hayes while James eliminated previous champion Mike Rhodes in the semis and second seed Mark Jackson in the quarters. A star-studded lineup was completed in the quarters by Chris Hansell and Earl Sweeney while former Basingstoke champion Sean Pickin failed to qualify from his group.

Another player to retain her title was Melanie Farquhar in the Junior Girls' Singles. Mel also picked up the Women's Singles and Cadet Singles titles to become the day's most successful player. In the female events Melanie beat Jenny Hansell into second place on each occasion while the runner-up in the Cadet Singles was Alex Polding who also retained his Under-13 Singles crown against Rachel Farquhar.

Bucks first team player Mike Rhodes beat county second team player Nick Hansell to land the Veterans' Singles. Tournament organizer Dave Bull got some reward for his efforts when partnering David Hayes to victory in the Championship Doubles with a nail-biting fifth game win over the fancied Robert Hansell and Mark Jackson.

GOOD START IN NJL

Cippenham teams did well in the first round of matches in the National Junior League on 8 November. The top boys' team (B) finished second in Division 1 after a 7-2 win over Milton Keynes A and 5-4 over division leaders ALNS but fell 3-6 to Waterside (Southampton). The C team top Division 2 having beaten Southampton 9-0 and Milton Keynes B 8-1 but falling 3-6 to Chesham High School A. The D and E teams are third and fourth in Division 3 while the young and inexperienced girls' team did well to lie in fifth place in their division after beating Barnet and Bournemouth both 5-4 and Waterside A 7-2 but going down to leaders Generation II (Fareham) 0-9.

DECENT START FOR BUCKS IN JUNIOR PREMIER DIVISION

The Bucks junior team, com prised entirely of Cippenham players, are well placed after the first weekend of matches, played at Cippenham over the first weekend in November. With one win, one draw and a narrow defeat from their three matches, Bucks are placed fifth but have played three of the four sides placed above them and none of the three below. This should augur well for an improved final position when the competition concludes at Grantham in March.

Bucks began well on Saturday afternoon with a 6-4 win over Cheshire with the local team winning all

six boys' events but losing the four girls' matches. Bradley Evans, Gavin Evans and James Milton were hardly troubled as they won the match for Bucks, losing only five games out of twenty-three between them.



Sunday morning brought a disappointing 6-4 defeat at the hands of defending champions Glamorgan. 10–years old Gavin won both his two matches against Stephen Bertsen and Shaun Hall but older brother Bradley lost to

Bertsen and James lost to Hall. Bradley picked up a win over Aled Rhys Howell and Gemma Chapman beat Sarah Hall for Bucks' other successes.

In the afternoon Bucks failed to turn a 5-3 advantage into victory and had to be content with a draw against Yorkshire. The difference between two league points and one point was as fine as Gavin's opening 13-11 fifth-end loss to the higher ranked Stephen Denny. Gavin later beat Richard Moss, as did James, and Bradley extracted some revenge for his brother by beating Denny. The other two successes were drawn by

the girls as Gemma and Emily Tucker both beat Tanya Waller but lost to Nicola White.

Terry Stars as Vets Start Well

Cippenham made a good start in their first season in Division 1 of the Veterans' British League over the weekend of 22-23 November. Even without star player Clive Payne, out through injury, Cippenham returned from the first half matches at Stoke-on-Trent having gained six points from a possible ten. Newcomer Terry Haley from Guildford, who also performed exceptionally well for Cippenham in the main British League first weekend back in September, excelled with nine straight wins from the number one position. Only his first match on Saturday morning, after the long drive, escaped him. Slough League players Mike Rhodes, who won four matches, and Paul Baker, who tasted success three times, backed Terry up with important wins.

The first match on Saturday brought with it Cippenham's biggest defeat, 5-1 at the hands of Bat & Ball. Terry lost his opening match 3-2 against Dave Robson in this but then beat Tony Gelder 3-0 to start his run of nine successive victories. Saturday afternoon was more pleasant as Mike won both his matches to go with the brace from Terry as Cippenham beat Irish team Shamrocks 4-2. The evening match saw another defeat against ultimate division leaders from Northumberland, Thompson Insurance "A".

Sunday was a more successful day with victories secured in both matches. Paul found his form to record two very good wins over Tom Adams and Steve Davis as Cippenham romped home 5-1 against Graham Spicer I. Mike also beat Adams but lost to Derek Holman whilst Terry beat both the New Malden team's top players, Holman and Davis. In the final match of the weekend Cippenham came back from 1-2 down to win the last three matches and take both points with a 4-2 victory over BATTS Racquetsports I. Terry got Cippenham off to a brisk start by beating Chris Brewer but defeats for Mike against Mark Romano and Paul against John Monk put us behind. The Cippenham comeback was kick started by another win for Terry, 3-2 over Romano and then Paul had a fantastic win over Brewer 3-1 and Mike hammered Monk 3-0 to ease Cippenham into third place, three points ahead of the chasing pack.
