It's the biggest Grand Prix yet as Cippenham buzzes on Tuesday evenings

Gerald Wins from the Front

uesday evening practice sessions at the Club are booming right now. The reason for this is the popular weekly Grand Prix competition, a series of events in which points are awarded for finishing positions each week, with the winner the player accumulating the most points over a six week period.

The eighth Grand Prix finished on 7 August and it was the closest finish and best supported yet. A record number of thirty-six players took part and in the end it was Gerald Finesilver, the winner of the first session at the beginning of July who was never headed and declared the overall winner.

A top four emerged over the weeks and going into the last session any one of three players could still have won the series. Steve Smith knew that he had to win the final stage if he was to have any chance of the title but even so Gerald would have to finish no higher than fourth on the night. Alan Farral could win also if he finished second or better and Gerald was third or lower. In the end Alan's hopes were dashed when he lost in the third-fourth play-off to Gerald after the latter had been beaten by Steve in the semi-final and Alan had lost at the same stage to Graham Trimming.

Those results confirmed Gerald as the overall champion with the other places determined by the result of the final match between Steve and Graham. Graham led 8-6 in the fifth and deciding game but in the end Steve became the sixth different winner in the six weeks to clinch second spot for himself and give Alan third ahead of Graham.

The six weekly events were won by Gerald Finesilver, Paul Elliott, Alan Farral, Paul Baker, Graham Trimming and Steve Smith.

The ninth Grand Prix is now progressing and players are treating it as the ideal way to get ready for the forthcoming season.

ippenham member Matt Ware bagged two gold medals in the recent Molndals BTK (Gothenburg) Open, taking the boys' U17 and boys' U20 titles. In the U20's he came from a unseeded position: in the quarter-finals he beat third seed Robin Pettersson 12-10 in the fifth and then in the semis he played Niclas Aberg winning 3-1. In the final he met the top seed and last year's men's winner at the K2 Grand Prix, Kalle Relfson. The final was a thrilling five set match which Matt took 11-9 in the fifth to take the title alongside his U17 title.

Matt, who is currently training in Sweden at the Molndals BTK Club, has been working hard over the last ten weeks with intensive training and working with a top Swedish tri-athlete on his fitness. It's clear to see that the hard work is paying off with these international results.

Senior British League

There is a new regulation in the British League this season: teams from the same club operating at the same level do not have to declare their top four players in team I, they can mix and match with team II so long as players only appear in one of those teams during the season. It was a Cippenham initiative and means that some of the top four in our ranking list can play in the team designated as Cippenham II operating in Division 1 South & Midlands because that is the same level as our designated first team playing in Division 1 South.

Although not finally decided it is likely that Martin, Mark B, Lee and one other will play as the first team and David, Danny, Rob and Mark J as the second team. In truth, are players are fairly well condensed in their ranking points quota apart from Martin who is some distance ahead.
