The Cippenham junior players had another good day at the Cotswold Junior 4-Star Open Championships during the weekend of 26/27th January with the most notable success being that of Rebecca Tweedy in winning the Cadet Girls' Grade 1 Singles after an all-Cippenham final duel with Sylvana Bielec.

The boys also performed well, none more so than the in-form James Milton. James reached the semi-final of the Cadet Boys' Singles on Saturday, losing to Niv Bogen from London Progress TTC but then beat Bogen the following day en route to the quarter-final of the Junior Boys' Open Singles. Bradley Evans also reached the semis of the Cadet Boys' Singles to give Cippenham their second representative at that stage while David Haves reached the same penultimate stage of the Junior Boys' Grade 1 Singles and, like John Camilleri, the last sixteen of the Junior Boys' Open Singles. These were all creditable performances in a strong entry with most of the top-ranked players in the country attending.
