Exciting conclusion to weekend

The new table tennis season got underway in September with the first matches in the Senior British Clubs League. Cippenham Table Tennis Club is hosting two of the divisions, as it has for many years, and fortune has provided that these two divisions are those in which the two Cippenham teams are represented

However, neither team was able to take full advantage of familiar conditions as both had disappointing results, that is at least until the very end of Sunday. When the final count was tallied, the Cippenham first team had one win to show from their four matches while the second team went one better with two victories.

The Cippenham first team could consider themselves to be a little unlucky on Saturday as both matches finished with the hosts at the wrong end of a 5-4 scoreline in Division A-2. Closely-fought wins for team captain Martin Adams, over Fernando Frandes, and Rob Hansell, over Sienna Jetha, followed by a win in the doubles by Martin and Andy Norwood put Cippenham 3-2 up against London Academy. However, three straight wins for London, albeit two of them by close margins in the deciding game, gave them an unassailable 5-3 lead before Martin completed his personal brace by beating Parsa Yamin.

The afternoon match against Fusion 2 followed a similar pattern with Cippenham again establishing a 3-2 lead as another doubles win, this time by Martin and Rob, was followed by singles wins for Rob Hansell and Shae Thakker. Once again, the next three sets were lost as Fusion went into a 5-3 lead before Martin gave the scoreline a more respectable outlook by beating Freddie Wilke.

Sunday morning brought more disappointment for Cippenham as Urban 2 ran out 8-1 winners. The only joy for the hosts came when Martin Adams beat Tommy Gritton but Shae Thakker somehow managed to lose a 9-3 lead in the fifth game against Costas Papantoniou, one of four sets that Cippenham lost in the deciding game.

Meanwhile, on the other side of the hall,



the Cippenham second team were playing in Division C-5, two tiers below the first team. They started well enough with a 6-3 victory over Fareham-based Generation 2. Jamie Woodford and Rachael Iles, who was nominated as player of the match, both won their two singles while Will Saint beat his opposite number one, Tim Hampton, and combined with Rachael to take the doubles.

Will, Jamie and Rachael all won one of their two singles encounters in the afternoon match against Bristol Associates. Will and Rachel again won their doubles but that was not enough as Cippenham slipped to a 5-4 defeat.

Worse was to follow on Sunday morning as having won three of the first four singles and the doubles to establish a 4-1 lead, the team inexplicably fell apart and lost all the remaining four to allow Horsham Spinners 3 take both league points. Only Anna Piercey, who unluckily lost the final set 13-11 in the fifth game to Asher Warshawski, offered much resistance.

The weekend, though, finished on a high for both teams as excitement reached fever pitch. Both teams' matches were on a knife-edge, and being only a few meters apart across the hall and in the best vantage positions for viewing, created a huge sense of theatre. Both matches reached a score of 3-2 in Cippenham's favour after the doubles sets. However, the first team only succeeded in one of the next three singles matches and that was when new signing Andy Norwood pulled off a scintillating 11-9 win in the fifth over Hugo

Nguyen, one of two young twins playing for Joola Plymouth. The second team also reached 4-4 as, after Will Saint had seen off Isle of Wight's number one Christos Hannides 3-1, to make the match score 4-2 in Cippenham's favour, the next two sets were agonisingly close but resulted in Jamie Woodford losing 11-9 in the fifth to Gabor Bodnar and Jaiden Caldeira missing out by an even closer score, 12-10 in the fifth to Rod McMullan.

The final acts of the weekend, with both matches poised at 4-4 and running parallel saw Martin Adams facing Plymouth's Dan Kerr while a few yards away Anna Piercey was up against the Islanders' long-pimples wielding Andy Prince who had already beaten Caldeira 3-0 and was attempting to establish a 4-0 win record for his team across the weekend. Both matches swayed backwards and forwards and both Cippenham players went two games to one down. Both then made it 2-2, Martin by the narrow margin of 12-10. Martin was again down in the fifth, 9-6, but to tumultuous acclaim finished the game off 13-11 and Cippenham first team had their first win of the season 5-4. Seconds later, Anna, showing immense composure, did the same except her fifth game was a more comfortable 11-5.

Girls do well in Premier Division

nother of the sections of the British Clubs League got underway in October. The venue was Derby Arena and this time it was the turn of the Youth British Clubs League, renamed this season from Junior British League. Apart from the name, it was the same set-up at the same venue as previous seasons and Cippenham was once again represented by two boys' teams and one girls' team.

Pride of place goes to the girls' team who were promoted to the Girls' Premier Division, a great achievement for a team who all train locally at Cippenham. Cippenham, who in the past have three times been national champions in this category, have not featured at the highest level since 2011 so this represent a great step forward. They did not disgrace themselves either as, after a torrid Saturday in which they lost heavily to the top three teams, they bounced back to win their two matches on Sunday to finish in a very creditable fourth place, trailing only to three powerhouses in London Academy, Grantham College and Draycott. Rachael Iles finished up winning half of her ten individual matches, while Mia Lakhani won only one less and Anna Piercey contributed one

Saturday was a difficult day against many of the top-ranked players in the country. The first match, against Draycott, finished 5-1 in the Derbyshire team's favour. Rachael recorded a great win against her opposing number one player Mabel Shute 3-0 but lost out over five games against Naomi Coker while Mia led Saskia Key 2-1 but ultimately suffered a narrow loss 16-14 in the fifth. The other two matches against Grantham College and London Academy were both lost 6-0 but three times the Cippenham girls took their illustrious opponents to five games after leading 2-0 or 2-1.

Sunday was a different story altogether. Both Rachael and Mia went through the day unbeaten as their team beat Greenhouse 4-2 and Belfast-based Ormeau 5-1.

The Cippenham boys' teams were operating lower down the divisions of their league, the first team in Division 4 and the second team in Division 7. The first



team had a difficult time in their division and finished the weekend without a win although they did gain one point with a 3-3 draw against eBatt 4. Jamie Woodford was the only player who returned good results and was even awarded the player of the match for his performance in the final match, a 2-4 loss to Wood Green. George Driscoll won once, helped by a concession from his opponent who retired injured, to gain his team that point against Wood Green while Nick Carter and Matt Ley, promoted from the second team for two matches, finished winless. The other match scores were 1-5 against Ormeau and two 0-6 defeats against Drumchapel Glasgow and SGS College Bristol.

The younger second team, though, went much better and lie in second place in their division after two wins, two draws and a solitary defeat to show for their five matches. Louis Alexander won seven of his ten matches while Bharath Prasanna Kumar weighed in with five out of eight and his 10-years old brother Sai, playing eight years out of his age group, won half of his eight.

Their weekend did not start well as Halton, from Widnes, ran out 4-2 winners. However, that was the first and last time that the team would taste defeat as they embarked of a four-match unbeaten run, starting with a 4-2 victory over Graham Spicer. Bharath was rested for this match, but Louis, player of the match, steered his team to victory with help from a win each from Matt Ley and Sai. After this, Matt was promoted to the first team and Louis and the Prasanna Kumar brothers played throughout. The third match on Saturday produced an even better result, 5-1 against Fusion 3, with Louis once again the player of the match. Bharath also picked up a brace albeit, three of Cippenham's individual wins each took five games to complete.

Sunday 's matches both produced 3-3 draws, against SGS College Bristol 2 and BrumFord 2 with all three Cippenham players winning a match apiece while the opposition number one players remained unbeaten.



The Veterans British Clubs League new season got underway at Derby in October with Cippenham's three teams, two men's and one women's, all performing creditably.

The men's first team of Dave Barr, Andy Trott, Martin Adams and new to the age-group, Rob Hansell, playing in Division 1A, had high hopes of starting their quest for the single promotion spot to the Premier Division from which they were relegated last season

However, they had to ultimately give second-best to a C Jenkins Windows team who went through the entire weekend not dropping a point. Martin Adams claimed the best record for Cippenham, winning eight of his ten individual matches while the other three players all tasted success in half of their matches.

Meanwhile, the Cippenham men' second team were operating in Division 3A and gained one victory and three draws from their five matches. Spearheading the team was Hari Gehlot, who has dropped down from having played several seasons in the first team, and he was assisted by team-mates Steve Joel, Samson Bekele and Paul Baker. For three of the first four matches the points were shared as Draycott 3, CVS Rams and Graham Spicer all held Cippenham to 3-3 draws. In between these drawn matches was Cippenham's only loss of the weekend when top-of-the-table Admiral Paws ran out 5-1 winners. A muchappreciated first win cam in the final match of the weekend against St Georges 2.

Cippenham Ladies were playing in Women's Division 3 and completed the first weekend in fifth place out of eight but with two of the lesser teams still to play before the division splits into top and bottom halves in the new year. Cippenham won two of their five matches and on both occasions the player of the match was Julie Dean.
