At Wolverhampton over the weekend 17/18th February the Cippenham Girls' "A" team, sponsored by law firm Addleshaw Booth, proved themselves head and shoulders above the competition and had retained the title they first won last year by Saturday evening with two matches still to be played. In fact it was as easy as "ABC" for Addleshaw Booth Cippenham who went through the entire season winning every match and had the enviable sets aggregate of 56-4.

The top team was not the only success story of the weekend, though. Cippenham Girls' "B" team retained the lead that they had established during the first weekend in October to win Division 2 and the Boys' "A" team cruelly lost out on a count-back in Division 1 despite also going through the season undefeated.

The Addleshaw Booth-sponsored Girls' "A" team of Joanna Parker, Gemma Chapman and Karen Shepherd were absolutely in a class of their own and were the top three girls in the division's averages. Karen remained unbeaten in all of her 20 matches, while Jo tasted defeat just once and Gemma three times. In the final weekend only Gemma lost a game and that was the first set on the Saturday morning when Team Peniel "A" were beaten 5-1. Thereafter Cippenham swept aside all opponents 6-0 — Gautby Girls, London Progress, Glamorgan Girls and BATTS (Harlow).

The Girls' "B" team led the way in Division 2 going into the final weekend whereupon Byng Hall (Tunbridge Wells) were defeated 4-2 and a 3-3 draw with Arundel secured top spot in the first stage. The division was then split into two halves and Cippenham played the

second to fourth placed teams again. This time Arundel were beaten 5-1 and 3-3 draws were played out with Byng Hall and Oakbank (Bradford). A draw was sufficient in the final match to win the title and this was secured as Cippenham raced into a 3-0 lead. Over the two weekends Emily Tucker and Gemma Hollett both won three-quarters of their 20 matches while Francesca Parnell won 14.

Cippenham Boys' "A" team had the unfortunate experience of leading the table all season and then being pipped at the post. Five wins and five draws from their ten matches were ultimately not sufficient and despite playing out a 3-3 draw with second-placed Glamorgan Boys in the final match, both teams were overtaken by London Boys relegating Glamorgan to third and Cippenham to runners-up spot. Ironically, London had to win 6-0 in their

Cippenham's men's team returned from a successful weekend (Feb 3/4) at BATTS, Harlow in the British League Division 1 South. Clive Payne was in tremendous form throughout, winning all of his eight matches as Cippenham took six points out of a possible eight in the League's third weekend. Clive was ably supported by Martin Adams, who won six, Wesley Bush-Harris (4) and Mike Rhodes who won only twice but was often beaten by the narrowest of margins.

The weekend got off to a great start as Cippenham demolished Enfield-based Ellenborough 7-1 in the opening fixture. After Wes had lost the opening set it was Cippenham all the way as they romped to victory over the bottom-placed team. Saturday continued with a 4-4 against PSP Moonrakers I (based at Westbury) with Martin and Wes adding one each to Clive's brace. It was the same combination of scorers who secured another 4-4 draw with Limberlost Pine Poole in the first match on Sunday. Following that, another double from Clive, two from Martin and one from Wes gave Cippenham a 5-3 victory over Horsham II in the final match.

## SPORT ENGLAND COACH OF THE YEAR FOR KEN

Cippenham TTC Head Coach Ken Phillips received the highest possible accolade on 16<sup>th</sup> February when he was presented with an England Coach of the Year Award for the year 2000.

The presentation was made at an awards ceremony in Leeds by Derek Casey of Sport England. The awards were decided by the National Coaching Foundation and in all there were six of them spread across

the whole spectrum of sporting disciplines, four voluntary and two professional. Ken received the award for Local Volunteer Coach in an Individual Sport.

This unique award for Ken comes after twice being presented with the ETTA Male Coach of the Year Award of which he is the only ever recipient. Ken started coaching at Cippenham in 1986 and has since also been coach for many years at the Maidenhead Association's base at Altwood School and has developed links between coaching activities at other local clubs and schools. He is also Head Coach for the Southern Region and is actively involved in coach education programmes as a tutor and assessor of student coaches.

Ken was instrumental in the early success of both Terry Young and Gareth Herbert who are now both members of England's team in the European League. More recently he has coached England junior and cadet internationals Gemma Chapman, Joanna Parker, Martin Rule and Bradley Evans and national age group champions Jesper Hougaard, Warren Brooks and

Robert Wilson. The next crop of youngsters is even more impressive

including 7-years old Gavin Evans who is already ranked number 9 in England under-12s.

Although Ken has been responsible for the development of many individual star players he is even more successful at producing champion teams of players. Slough and Maidenhead teams have dominated the junior and cadet national team championships, winning ten titles in the past five years, all with players developed at Cippenham.

#### Four Up For Gemma - Bradley Moves Up & Gear

Both titles stayed at home at the Cippenham Junior 3 Star Open Championships on 3<sup>rd</sup> February. In fact, seven of the eight awards were made to Cippenham Table Tennis Club members.

The final of the Boys' Singles was contested by the top two seeds, both members of Cippenham's teams in the Junior British League. However, the roles were reversed with second seed Bradley Evans, only 11 years of age, playing some of the best table tennis of his young life to defeat Robert Hansell, five years his senior, 21-13, 21-9. Six of the last eight players were Cippenham members and Robert Lemon joined the two finalists in the semi-finals. The three who fell in the quarters were James Milton (to Robert H), John Camilleri (to Robert L) and Stuart Tweedy (to Bradley).

Other Cippenham players who qualified from the initial round groups for the championships proper included Ross Drabble and Paul Zeun.

Gemma Chapman, top seed, was head and shoulders above the field in the Girls' Singles and won the title for the fourth successive year. The 15-year old from Maidenhead beat Kent's Gemma Yarnley in the final by the emphatic scoreline of 21-10, 21-9. Other Cippenham members who performed well were Gemma Hollett, who reached the semi-final, Rebecca Tweedy, who reached the quarters, and Jenny Hansell and Caroline Linz who both progressed out of the first round groups.


