

#### **Domination at National Team Finals**





Teams from Cippenham Table Tennis Club's elite coaching group won three of the four national team competitions for juniors and cadets at Bury St. Edmunds over the weekend of 12/ 13<sup>th</sup> June. Never was the immense strength in depth of young talent at the Club more in evidence than in the finals of the two cadet events in which all of the twelve players that competed for Maidenhead, Slough and High Wycombe receive their coaching at Cippenham and for Maidenhead there was a double celebration as they captured also the girls' U17 event.

The weekend started, on Saturday, in fine style for Maidenhead in the Bromfield Trophy (U17 girls) with an unexpected win over Leeds 5-2 in a semi-final match which, if the results had gone with rankings, would have seen the scoreline reversed 5-2. All of the Leeds girls are ranked in the top 22 in England. Gemma Chapman, ranked 18 in England, scored a memorable maximum three wins to set up victory for Maidenhead yet it was the devastating form of Emma Human, ranked outside of the top 50, who turned a probable defeat into victory with two-straight wins over Sarah Donnelly and Janine Donnelly. As it turned out that semi-final was the harder match and the final brought a more expected win over Harlow, also by 5-2. Gemma again won her three games

while Emma and Jane Dickens both won their opening encounters to put Maidenhead in a very strong position.

To cap a majestic double for Maidenhead, Gemma and Emma turned out again on the Sunday, along with Joanna Parker, to capture the Hammersley Cup, the championship for U14 girls. Maidenhead were hot favourites for this title and easily dismissed Leicester 5-0 in the semi-final. Slough, on the other hand, were made to work very hard to gain an impressive 5-2 win over Leeds. Francesca Parnell put Slough into the lead with a 22-20, 21-19 win in her first set and then Hannah Stone came back from a first game deficit to put Slough further ahead. Hannah went on to win her three matches and was supported by a win from Helen Smith as Slough progressed. The result of the final was never in doubt as Maidenhead romped to another 5-0 win over Slough.

The best and closest matches of the day were in the Leach Cup, the competition for U14 boys. In the first semi-final Slough went 2-0 down to Sudbury when Bradley Evans, still then only nine years of age and the new U10 English champion, squandered a 17-10 lead in the second game after winning the first. Thomas Mitchell then produced the first of a magnificent treble, all won in the deciding game, that proved to be the decisive factor. 12-years old Thomas was well supported by 11-years old David Hayes, who won twice, and a solitary win for Bradley as Slough turned earlier disarray into a 6-2 triumph.

In the second semi-final High Wycombe overcame an unexpected defeat for their number one player Warren Brooks to get past West Wiltshire 5-3.

The stage was set for a local derby final between the best two cadet teams in the country. High Wycombe's older and more experienced team was set against the incredible youth of the Slough team whose ages totalled just 32. David Hayes' first set defeat by Chris Hansell seemed to have swung the match totally in Wycombe's favour for the latter knew that they could rely upon three wins from Warren Brooks, last year's national U12 champion. Incredibly, Slough won all five of the other matches at their disposal and by the time David finished off Stuart Tweedy 21-8 in the third game a 5-4 victory was assured and the Leach Cup was on its way to rest in Slough for the third time in four years. Thomas and Bradley also won twice for the victors.

After an incredible weekend at Bury St. Edmunds in which players from the Cippenham club had won three of the four junior age group events and provided all the finalists in the U14 section, the Club's coaches were left with the satisfaction of not only having dominated the rest of the country this year but for having produced seven national championship winning teams in only four seasons.

# **GIRLS DOMINANT IN WNJL**

Cippenham gained maximum success in the girls' section of the Woolwich National Junior League (Southern Region) which was concluded on 6<sup>th</sup> June. Cippenham's top team of Claire Smart, new national under-12 champion Joanna Parker and Rebecca Eldridge won the top division with the second team of Hannah Stone, Helen Smith and Francesca Parnell finishing runners-up. For good measure Cippenham's third team comprising Katherine Tweedy, Alex Hedley, Emily Tucker and Jasjote Grewal won Division 2.

The boys did not fare quite so well with Cippenham's top team losing their position at the top of Division 1 through a combination of an injury sustained on the day by John Camilleri and the indifferent form of Ben Beveridge and Dan Jacobs. They finished in runners-up position but more satisfaction was gained from the performance of a very young second team who leapt from fifth to joint third. The future stars of Slough table tennis were present in this team in the shape of 12-years old Thomas Mitchell, a semi-finalist the week before in the under-12 national championships, 9 years-old Bradley Evans, the new national under-10 champion, and 11-years old David Hayes, recent winner of the Cippenham Under-12 Open title.

# CIPPENHAM NEWS WARREN, GEMMA AND JAMES LEAD THE FIELD AT THE YOUNG PLAYERS' FESTIVAL

ippenham's last event of the season, the first Young Players' Summer Festival proved a massive success on two counts. The Club's first two-day event attracted 85 players, all under the age of 14, from all over the southern half of England and Wales and also provided wins for home players in three events.

Cippenham players dominated the top age group events for the U13s providing both of the finalists in the boys' and girls' singles. In fact Cippenham provided five of the quarterfinalists in the U13BS and three in the U13GS. Both of the events were won by the top seeds, respectively Warren Brooks and Gemma Chapman who fended off the challenges of Thomas Mitchell and Helen Smith in the finals. The player who would have gained most satisfaction was Helen who only qualified from her first round group as runner-up but then went on to defeat second seed Jo Hubbard (Kent) in the guarter-final and fourth seed Kelly Sibley (Warwickshire) in the semi. Apart from the finalists, Cippenham's other quarter-finalists were Ross Drabble, James Milton, Stuart Tweedy and Emily Tucker.

James went on to win the U11BS later on Sunday, the top seed always being a class above the rest of the field and then beating Matthew Thomas of Middlesex in the final.

The Saturday events, for even younger players, led to two home finalists in Rebecca

Tweedy in the U9GS and Myles Evans in the U8BS. This was the first time that an open tournament in the UK had been organised for such young age groups and the concept was a remarkable success considering the table tennis season was in its summer recess. Myles also reached the guarter-finals of both the U9 and U10 events as did his brother Gavin (aged just 6) in the U8 and U9 events. Going one better to reach the semi-final of the U10BS was Joe Misseldine, aged 8.

Of the visitors the most successful were Cheltenham's impressive Harry Shahlaei who won both the U9 and U10BS while Lauren Spink from Norwich did likewise in the U10 and U11GS. The Welsh contingent tasted some success when Shaun Hall won the U8BS while Reading's Melanie Farquhar won the U9GS.
